VOYAGING INTO THE WORLD

More than a focus on motherhood, this project also carries the search for my personal voice, my personal home and this in relationship with society. During a solo part this piece gives fully space to discover my personal expression.

In a second part I explore what happens to this personal truth in interaction with others. It's a dynamic play in which you find and lose each other and yourself. Can you stay true to yourself and in the meantime open up for others? Can you sing your own melody and still be in connection?
